ADVOCACY

Theater Arts

Ana began Theater Arts, a Correctional Institute for Women, National Penitentiary program for women that supports reformation and education of persons deprived of liberty (PDLs). One of Ana's favorite activities is coaching PDLs to perform Shakespeare-inspired plots, in their own dialects, with their own circumstances. Her class is comprised of 89 women, and their sentences are commuted down by participating in her classes.

She has taught them self-authoring in "My Story" and has led the translation of Shakespeare to their own native dialects: Waray, Ilocano, Visayan, and Tagalog. The women inmates have performed excerpts of Macbeth, Hamlet, As You Like It, and Midsummer Night's Dream. In addition, Ana brings professional actors and college students to the prison yearly for an integrated workshop and performances of Hamlet, Alls Well That Ends Well, Macbeth, and As You Like It.

Kindness Kitchen

Ana created Kindness Kitchen with iNay Programs, inspired by her experience attending a leadership retreat by Moved by Love and <u>ServiceSpace</u> in Ahmedabad, India. Kindness Kitchen is a volunteer-driven experiment in generosity where meals are paid forward and prepared by volunteers. Kindness Kitchen began as an expression of compassion, when retreat participants prepared meals for the homeless, and travelled to sectors of the city of Metro Manila to share and connect with the underprivileged. Inspired by Karma Kitchen.

Artist Mentoring Program

AMP is a sharing circle for supporting artists and student-artists. There is no leader in the circle, each person and place is important. In the circle, each person comes to be well, we are seeker, medicine, and doctor for each other. Sharing is optional.

Salamat Space

Salamat Space is a sharing circle which began as an expression of gratitude. The sharing circle begins and ends with a quiet moment of silence. There is no leader and each person and place in the circle is important. Sharing is optional.

Entheos Retreat

Entheos is the root word of "enthusiasm," and in Greek en theos means "in God." Ana designed Entheos retreats as an open, non-denominational retreat that practices rituals from different faith traditions: Catholicism, Buddhism, and Hinduism. Entheos retreats use music, dance, drums, masks, and play. Entheos retreats are open to any person or company, and are a non-threatening, gentle guided retreat for reflection and introspection.
